Texas Master Naturalists

Texas Master Naturalist Program

Mission: To develop a corps of well-informed volunteers dedicated to the beneficial management of natural resources and natural areas within their communities

Texas Master Naturalist Program

- Complete an organized training program
 - 40 hours of instruction composed of both classroom and field experiences.
 - Obtain a minimum of 8 hours of approved advanced training.
 - Complete a minimum of 40 hours of chapter approved volunteer service.
- Annual re-certification
 - Minimum of 8 hours of advanced training
 - Minimum of 40 hours of volunteer service in approved project activities.

- Certification of 75 new TMN volunteers (join 493 active TMNs)
- TMN volunteers contribute 36,752 hours (25.8 FTEs), valued at \$766,280 (\$20.85/hr via Independent Sector).



Sea Grant takes me to the power of WE!

- Transplanted 32,346 plants
- Development of 8.15 miles of nature trails
- Restoration of >5,000 acres of habitat.
- Conducted 567 educational programs for > 19,000 people
